Pope Francis was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina on 17 December 1936 to Italian immigrants. He was one of 5 children. He was ordained a Jesuit priest on 13 December 1969. He was appointed as the Auxiliary Bishop of Buenos Aires in May 1993 and succeeded his predecessor as the Archbishop of Buenos Aires. In 2001, Pope John Paul II created him Cardinal and on 13 March 2013, he was elected 266th Pope of the Universal Catholic Church,

Pope Francis was known for his humility, simplicity and special care for the marginalized. His Papacy focused on mercy, creation, justice, synodality and encounter Major milestones included: Two synods on the family, the Jubilee year of Mercy and the Synod of synodality. His Encyclicals focused on compassion, mercy and justice for the poor. He was a champion of Inter-faith dialogue. He said, 'there can be no peace without freedom of Religion, thought, expression and respect for others. He exhorted the believers by saying that Faith must be lived and not merely believed.

Earlier as the Archbishop of Buenos Aires, he often said, "My people are poor, and I am one of them". He lived in an apartment and cooked his own meals. He travelled by buses and subways to reach out to people. He urged priests to show mercy and courage and to keep their doors open. He warned against, "Spiritual- Worldliness" – being self-centered and called for social justice. His simple message: 'to follow Christ is to recognize that trampling on human dignity is a grave sin'.

Pope Francis died on Easter Monday at 7.35 AM, 21st April 2025 in Rome, after more than 12 years as Bishop of Rome and shepherd of the Universal Catholic Church. We entrust the soul of Pope Francis, our beloved shepherd of the Church to God's mercy, whom he served so faithfully and with mercy. Amen.
